Stationery for Key Stage 2

Although I am slightly envious of the bright spark who invented Smiggle, their pencil cases are taking over some classrooms. It comes to something when we have over £150 of pencil cases, if not more in some rooms. So next year I am going to ask that pupils in Years 3 –6 only bring in a small pencil case and with a more limited range of equipment. No one needs 3 or 4 smelly rubbers and bendy pencils.

Key Stage 1 (Years 1 and 2) do not need to bring in any pencil case to the class; they can keep one in their bag for wet play.

Fidget Spinners will not be allowed in school unless your child has an official diagnosis of ADHD and a spinner is recommended by their paediatrician.

Below is what is required in Key Stage 2

Two lead pencils

Handwriting pen (no more than 2) – when pen licence been awarded

A rubber

A small self-contained sharpener

A 15cm ruler

A glue stick (to be replaced when empty)

A whiteboard pen

A highlighter

Green pen for editing

**All of the above must be placed in a pencil case that is compact enough to fit into a shallow tray. We recommend one that is approx. 20cm by 12cm.

A small set of colouring pencils

If a larger pencil case is brought in then it will be kept in the child's bag and not in the classroom.

Other

An art shirt (which can be kept in school)

A water bottle
