Parent Questionnaires

Thank you to everyone who completed a parent questionnaire. The results have been shared with the Governors and they are also very grateful for so many of you replying. Here are the results;

My child feels safe at this School—94.3% strongly agree or agree

The School deals with any cases of bullying effectively. (Bullying includes persistent name calling, cyber, racist and homophobic bullying) - 89.1% strongly agree or agree

This school ensures my child is well looked after-93.6% strongly agree or agree

The School keeps me well informed - 87.9% strongly agree or agree

My child is making good progress at this School-88% strongly agree or agree

My child is taught well at this School-90% strongly agree or agree

This School helps my child to develop skills in communication, reading, writing and maths - 89.2% strongly agree or agree

This School helps me to support my child's learning - 85.8% strongly agree or agree

This School meets my child's particular needs8-6.4% strongly agree or agree

There is a good standard of behaviour at this School—93.6% strongly agree or agree

My child's lessons are not disrupted by bad behaviour - 87.2% strongly agree or agree

The School responds well to my concerns - 85.1% strongly agree or agree

The School is well led and managed - 93.4% strongly agree or agree

I would recommend this school to another parent - 98.5%

Much of your feedback was extremely positive and everyone at school appreciates your comments. There was one comment about behaviour and a parent wanting tougher sanctions taken against children they thought were 'regular offenders.' I am more than happy to discuss this issue directly but every child who gets more than one blue code is supported. Many children have complex issues which they are dealing with at home or have significant SEND needs which can impact on their behaviour.

The children who keep the rules are rewarded in a number of ways; housepoints; some classes have class rosettes or 'Star of the Day', there is the weekly celebration assembly and stickers, weekly Golden Time and then the half termly Golden Time Plus for Years 1-6.

I also appreciate the feedback that there have been times when you and your child has not known who will be teaching the class. It is very difficult at the moment to recruit supply staff and very expensive. There are times when we have someone in place and then they have pulled out or I just haven't known about a supply teacher until the last minute. I will try to keep you informed in good time but it is not always possible.

Esafety

I also asked on the questionnaire if any of you wanted advice on Esafety and social media. We will be looking to hold a parents workshop on this in the Autumn term. I occasionally get sent some information from the County Safeguarding Team and I will now send this out to you when it comes in. It is often aimed at older children but with the access to social media that many children have it would help keep you informed.

Muscal.ly has been mentioned in school by the children. For those of you who don't know about it it allows your child (or you) to upload videos of themselves singing or lip synching to other videos. It appears to be very sweet and funny at first but many of the comments posted about the videos are verbally abusive and many of the other links or hashtags you can click on take you to sites which have very inappropriate content on them, some of which is pornographic.

If you come across anything that you feel we should know about then please let us know. It is only by sharing this information we can keep our children safe.
