Many of you responded to my request for information regarding the affects of Service life on you and your children for which I was very grateful. Despite a strong case and support from the Station, we were unsuccessful in our bid for funding to make improvements to our playground. The MOD Education Support Fund received 224 applications from schools across the country, with only 76 being successful, (some of those 76 only being awarded partial funding). There will be another bidding round (with a smaller fund and stricter eligibility criteria) opening in June. We will therefore look to adjust and resubmit our application later in the year.

Whilst we are always sad see pupils move on from our school, we are aware that some of you will be being posted between now and the end of the school year. With this in mind, we would be grateful for as much notice of any postings as possible, although we appreciate that this can be difficult! This allows the teaching staff time to prepare books and reports for you to take to your child's new school and also for us to complete some transition work with your child to prepare them for the move. It is also useful to be able to give Service families moving into the area, an idea as to whether we can offer their child/ren a place at our school, and therefore help to reduce one of the stresses of postings!
