## Task 3.

Make a 24 hour clock diary to show exactly what you do in a typical lockdown day.

Include as much detail as you can eg. 6.25 woke up, 7.05 am ate frosties, 9.25am did Mymaths etc.

Write some questions and answers to yourself about your day: Eg: how long did I spend in total: Eating, sleeping, playing Which did I do more of sitting down or moving activities? How many minutes were spent watching devices? What do I want to reduce/ increase tomorrow?

## Practical work:

Task1. Explore the habitat of your garden. Go outside and lift up stones, look under bushes, gently shake trees and see how many creatures you can find. Look closely at what you have found - can you see their body parts?

Think about what conditions your living things need: damp? Warmth? Sunlight?

Task 2. Create an imaginary creature and its habitat.

When you have completed a Mymaths activity, it can be submitted to the teacher to see. When you click on the 'Homework' tab, you are shown the homework and the lesson. We do expect the children to do the lesson first as this is where the teaching and practice is. When the child does the homework, they are given a score. If mistakes have been made, we encourage the children to go back and have another try; this may involve going back to look at the lesson again. If you click on 'Summary' which is a tab on the left hand-side, you can see your score and choose to 'try again'.

The 'Scores' tab gives the children a chance to let the teacher know what they thought about the task. There is also a link to allow them to repeat the task/lesson and this is where they will find teacher feedback.

The Daily lesson on BBC Bitesize is good fun- make sure you look out for the 7-9 year olds one.
