Hello from Eco Club.

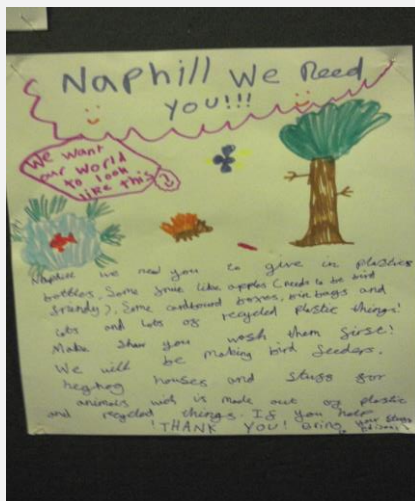
We would like to inform you about what we have been doing.
