Key achievements to date: Sept 2020

Equipment is regularly renewed so the children are using good equipment. which in turn can be a motivating factor.

The school has and is proud of its sporting achievements and any child who represents the school is awarded certificates and recognised in assembly. The children take part in a wide range of events so there is a whole range of activities for them to participate in.

Playground Buddies are well supported and valued part of the school. They model the importance of playing and the added qualities of leadership. cooperation and responsibility.

PE lessons have continued in class bubbles, purchasing more equipment has allowed for full range of sports to be taught this year as equipment. Having more has allowed for lessons to be taught uninterrupted by need for extra cleaning and isolating.

Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:

The booster swimming for the current Yr 4 worked well the previous year and many reached 25m. However we were not able to complete swimming for the current Yr 4 and only one class had their full amount of time.

Swimming is due to start in Nov 2020 and we will take Yr3. With a change of staff in Yr 3 we will need to train teachers and this will happen in November too.

We have booked swimming slots for the year but will have to see if that is possible.

We will need to look at indoor activities that can safely take place with the lnew guidance.

Top Up swimming for current Yr3s will need to take place. Very few can swim 25m confidently with a range of strokes and have good water safety skills. Their sessions have been so interrupted and short good assessments not been able to happen. Some extra sessions will happen at the end of June 2021 for the non-swimmers just to build more confidence.

Depending on what happens with bubbles etc next year and any implications with changes to what is expected in school more equipment maybe needed and we may have to look at more external clubs being provided.

We are considering purchasing a new online gymnastics scheme of work. Having viewed it it will provide session lead by qualified gymnastic coaches/teachers and it uses mainly PE mats which will support any lessons if equipment still has to be reduced.

Gymnastics is hard to teach and having a scheme for KS2 will help the teachers improve their own knowledge and practice.

45 out of 53 of our children completed swimming lessons with us.

In Autumn Term 2019 we were taking Yr 3 classes for half a term each with the aim that we would then use the PE premium to provide top up lessons for those who could not swim 25m. We aimed to give those children two extra terms of swimming so not only could they confidently swim 25m but have developed their ability to use different strokes. This group of children only had one extra half term before lockdown.	
Next year we will, if allowed, start with Yr 3 and as they are a small year group, we should be able to in the Spring term take those Yr4s who we had identified as needing extra swimming.	
Obviously not able to complete for 19/20 – we are planning to do the same for 20/21.	
As stated above swimming this academic year very disrupted. Will use top up swimming for this year group to repeat lessons next year.
