Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
June 2022	
Year 4 were able to complete swimming having missed so much last year. Inter school competitions have started again and we have been able to send teams to most events, we missed one event in spring 2022 due to Covid. PE team have recognised the areas of the subject that need developing more and have purchased a new Scheme Of Work that will allow for a clear progression of skills and introduce new sports. New resources have been purchased to ensure all sports can be delivered and so that each KS has a bag of general equipment that will be needed in most lessons.	It is clear there is a large group of children in current year 5 who are non-swimmers, many new to the school since the children had some swimming in Yr 4. The school will need a plan to take these children next year when they are in Yr6. Monitoring of lessons from new scheme will need to take place, support for teaching of new sports may need support. The main focus of spending this year will be to; develop or add to the PE, physical activity and sport that your school provides build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now are sustainable and will benefit pupils joining the school in future years
