Key achievements to date: July 2023	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
<p>New scheme of work – Getset4PE bought in. PE leads planned out units of work for all year groups. CPD given to year groups who had new units to teach. New assessment system linked to scheme in place. Pupil interviews and lesson observations show teachers using new scheme effectively.</p> <p>Recognised a larger number than usual in Yr6 could not swim 25m – Covid and new arrivals main factors why not. These 16 children given a whole term of booster swimming lessons.</p>	<p>Long term plan will have to be revised in light of mixed aged classes in Yr1/2.
