READING: Read with an adult **at least 3 times over the week and record** in their Reading Diary (these will be checked weekly). Children need to discuss ideas/words from the story **with an adult** and respond to questions about what they have read.

Y6 GRAMMAR AND PUNCTUATION: Complete and mark the Year 6 English Grammar and Punctuation Test 4. You can print the sheet or just write the answers on scrap paper. Due Friday 15th May.

SPELLINGS: Words that use apostrophes to show possession (including plurals) for test Friday 15th May. Possessive plurals that end in -s just need an apostrophe. Irregular plurals need an apostrophe and -s afterwards. Proper nouns ending in -s can be written with 's or just an apostrophe after the -s. It is more common in modern English to use 's. For ancient words it is common to just place the apostrophe after the -s. E.g. Charles's and Charles' are both grammatically correct but Charles's is preferred. Socrates' is preferred as it is an ancient name. In Group 3 the first version of the word is preferred.
